Introduction

Twenty-six keys have been defined as Korean Jamo (consonants and vowels) from the keyboard. The mapping of Jamo on the keyboard is shown below:

Operations Overview

1. Initial State:

The initial input state is English input mode. The status line is displayed as "「영문」".

2. Enter into / Exit from Korean IME Mode:

To enter into Korean IME Mode from English input mode, press [Ctrl(Left/Right)+Space]. The input status will change to Korean input mode and the status line will display "한글".

To exit from Korean IME mode into English input mode, press [Ctrl(Left/Right)+Space]. The input status will change to English input mode.

3. Input Korean Jamos:

A maximum of five Jamos can be typed each time. The typed Jamo key will be displayed in a Pre-Edit Area by composing an intermediate (pre-composed) Korean character (syllable).

For example, type 'ㄱ' and 'ㅏ'. The Pre-Edit Area will display: '가'.

4. Modify Jamos:

Before you commit a pre-composed character into a Korean character, you can modify the pre-composed Korean character by using the following methods:

- Press the BackSpace key to remove the last typed Jamo.
- Press the Delete key to clear the entire Pre-Edit Area.

Available Function Keys

1. In Korean Input Mode:

Available Key	Specific Function	Note
a~z	Type Korean Jamos.	--
BackSpace	Erases the last typed Jamo.	#1
Delete	Clears the entire Pre-Edit Area.	#1
Ctrl+Space	Exits from Korean IME mode and returns to English input mode.	--
Other keys	Return to the application.	--

Note:

1. If there are no characters present in the Pre-Edit Area, the input will be returned to the application.
